

Food Hubs Work Together to Aggregate and Distribute Local Food

Together, the Grand Rapids and Aitkin Farmers Market Hubs work collaboratively to source and aggregate local food as a regional network. During the height of harvest in the summer months, a steady stream of “hyperlocal” produce makes it into Market Share boxes, Veggie Rx programs, into Ball jars on pantry shelves, and onto plates at local restaurants. Aitkin Farmers Market Hub manager Allison Rian, and Grand Rapids Farmers Market Hub manager Wiliyn Dowell, coordinate to keep food fresh and safe on the almost 80 mi journey between the furthest farms and their hubs.

As the harvest season winds down and root vegetables remain available, only a few farms have the storage capacity to continue deliveries. To meet the demands of local food for area farm to school programs and Riverwood's Food Rx program, Dowell and Rian again joined forces to meet a minimum order with the Food Farm in Wrenshall, Minnesota, for one major aggregation effort.

Between both food hubs, 1,786 lbs. of food was ordered from the Food Farm and delivered on November 15th to Riverwood Healthcare Center, where local food champions were present to continue the distribution. Food delivered was sorted and weighed to create 54 boxes for Riverwood's first Winter Food Rx box which contained 1 lb. beets, 2 lbs. rutabaga, 7 lbs. potatoes, 6 lbs. squash, 5 lbs. onions, 5 lbs. cabbage and 0.75 lbs. of garlic. Rian additionally made a farm to school delivery to Aitkin High School and Rippleside Elementary School. That food made it onto school kids' plates the next day.

Jane Jewett, from Palisade MN, collected the Grand Rapids area order and made the next leg of the journey to connect with Dowell, who then made more school deliveries from there. Jewett's transport vehicle also included pork from a farmer in Cambridge and apples from Gilby's Orchard in Aitkin, destined for school kids' trays around the Grand Rapids area.

Everyone counted it a successful day for local farmers and consumers!
